## **Directors' Statement**

How to make a retablo. Start with a doorway covered in milagros and a dusty backdrop of the Franklin Mountains. Add a bolero, a costume or two, a candle if the theatre will allow it, two directors, eight actors, a village of talented artists and the poetry of RETABLOS. Spend three weeks in intense conversation, and soon you're smelling the caldo de pollo, you're seeing the murals in the El Segundo neighborhood of El Paso, you're dancing to "Adoro" at the quinceañera in VFW Post 8782, you're listening to the sobbing and laughter of a mother and father who have sacrificed so their kids can have a decent life this side of the Rio Grande. The flaming heart of Octavio Solis. Enter into these 13 retablos with us. They will change you. Don't sit back, lean in. "Ándale, before the song ends!"

## Author's Note

**I** am known primarily as a playwright, but when I wrote *Retablos*, I heard the voice of that "little brown shit" that was me as a boy relay them aloud as a collection of prose vignettes, and that's how I transcribed them. I have resisted any effort to adapt them to the stage because they are not meant for it. I would have written them as plays if they were. But if there is a company on earth that is perfectly suited to these very personal stories, it is Word for Word, because they honor the language of the page while managing to theatricalize the words in rare and unpredictable ways. This wondrous method is what transforms my *Retablos* into a magic pop-up book depicting people from my very real past living with vitality and dignity in the El Paso of my youth. Sheila Balter and Jim Cave have taken the trip there, metaphorically and literally. They visited my hometown to look for the heart of *Retablos* and their beautiful work on my book is proof that they found it. -Octavio Solis

> <sup>66</sup>A retablo is a devotional painting, usually laid on a small, thin plate of cheap, repurposed metal, in which a dire event is depicted—an accident, a crime, an illness, a calamity, some terrible rift in a person's life, which they survive thanks to the intercession of the Divine. They are ex-voto, that is, 'from a vow,' commissioned and created as a form of thanks. At once visual and literary, they record the crisis, the divine mediation and the offering of thanks in a single frame, thus forming a kind of flash-fiction account of an electrifying, life-altering event." —from *Retablos*

**Octavio Solis** is a playwright and director whose works Mother Road, Quixote Nuevo, Hole in the Sky, Alicia's Miracle, Se Llama Cristina, John Steinbeck's The Pastures of Heaven, Ghosts of the River, Quixote, Lydia, June in a Box,

Lethe, Marfa Lights, Gibraltar, The Ballad of Pancho and Lucy, The 7 Visions of Encarnación, Bethlehem, Dreamlandia, El Otro, Man of the Flesh, Prospect, El Paso Blue, Santos & Santos, and La Posada Mágica have been mounted at the California Shakespeare Theatre, Mark Taper Forum, Yale Repertory Theatre, the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the Denver Center for the Performing Arts, the Dallas Theater Center, the Magic Theatre, Intersection for the Arts, South Coast Repertory Theatre, the San Diego Repertory Theatre, the San Jose Repertory Theatre, Shadowlight Productions, the Venture Theatre in Philadelphia, Latino Chicago Theatre Company, Boston Court and Kitchen Dog Theatre, the New York Summer Play Festival, Teatro Vista in Chicago, El Teatro Campesino, the Undermain Theatre in Dallas, Thick Description, Campo Santo, the Imua Theatre Company in New York, and Cornerstone Theatre.

His collaborative works include *Cloudlands*, with Music by Adam Gwon; *Burning Dreams*, cowritten with Julie Hebert and Gina Leishman; and *Shiner*, written with Erik Ehn. Solis has received an NEA 1995-97 Playwriting Fellowship, the Roger L. Stevens award from the Kennedy Center, the Will Glickman Playwright Award, a production grant from the Kennedy Center Fund for New American Plays, the 1998 TCG/NEA Theatre Artists in Residence Grant, the 1998 McKnight Fellowship grant from the Playwrights Center in Minneapolis, and the National Latino Playwriting Award for 2003. He is the recipient of the 2000-2001 National Theatre Artists Residency Grant from TCG and the Pew Charitable Trust, the United States Artists Fellowship for 2011, and the 2014 Pen Center USA Award for Drama. Solis is a Thornton Wilder Fellow for the MacDowell Colony, New Dramatists alum, and member of the Dramatists Guild. He is working on commissions for the Arena Stage, SF Playhouse, and South Coast Repertory Theatre.

*The River Plays,* his anthology of plays about the US/Mexico border, is published by NoPassPort Publishing. *Retablos: Stories From A Life Lived Along The Border* is published by City Lights Books in San Francisco.

Solis' relationship with Word for Word extends back 20 years, when he directed their production of "Slaughterhouse" by Greg Sarris. In 2010, he adapted John Steinbeck's "The Pastures of Heaven" (which was one of the five NEA Distinguished New American Plays) for a Word for Word collaboration with Cal Shakes. Octavio Solis is a member of Word for Word's Authors Council.



**Greg Sarris** is an author, scholar, teacher, and Tribal Chairman of the Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria (FIGR), formerly the Federated Coast Miwok. He co-authored bill H.R. 5528, which President Clinton signed in 2000, restoring the

FCM as a recognized American Indian Tribe. Sarris' books include Keeping Slug Woman Alive: A Holistic Approach to American Indian Texts; Grand Avenue (an HBO Miniseries); Watermelon Nights; and How a Mountain Was Made. Word for Word has produced his stories "Slaughterhouse" and "Joy Ride," and created two children's touring shows from his collection How a Mountain Was Made. Currently, Word for Word works closely with Mr. Sarris and FIGR to provide summer arts programs for Native youth. He is the Honorary President of Word for Word's Authors Council.



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
